

The Little Rock Foundation is a 100% volunteer, 501 c (3) non-profit organization of parents who have children with blindness, visual impairment and other disabilities. Formed in 1997, after we were informed our son Rocco would be blind due to a premature birth and retinopathy of prematurity. We were not prepared for the profound lack of information and resources available for parents and families of visually impaired children. So we decided to form an organization dedicated to improving the lives of children who have visual challenges.

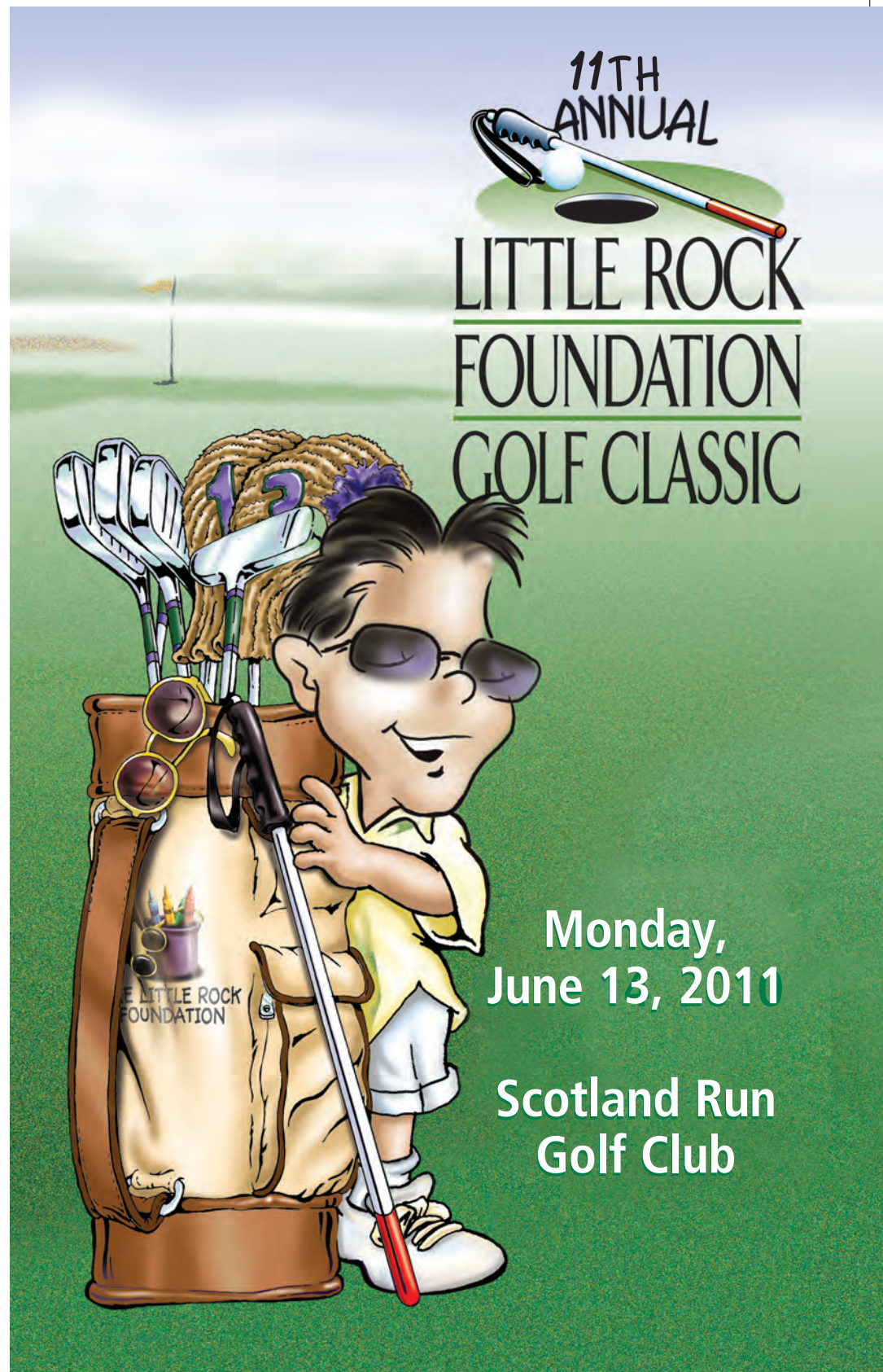
- **Family Resource Centers** located within Wills Eye Hospital and Children's Hospital of Philadelphia, provide information on resources and support services available within your community. The centers provide computer workstations which have access to resourceful links to the Library for the Blind, medical technology, specific eye diseases and support services. There are shelves of categorized periodicals on the many services available for families raising children with poor vision or no vision at all.
- **Camp Little Rock** is the only camp in the tri-state area that provides blind or visually impaired children the opportunity to participate in a day camp program. Camp is held on the beautiful grounds of the YMCA Camp Ockanickon in Medford, New Jersey. Activities include fishing, boating, hiking, swimming, horseback riding, challenge course, talent show and many other camp related activities.
- **Community Events & Outreach Program** Community events are held throughout the year to help foster friendships and networking between families and their children. Our outreach program gives back to the community by educating our future teachers, discussing the issues and concerns of teaching a child with little or no vision within the classroom. The program informs teachers how to refine learning systems and techniques that will mainstream children into today's complex society. The foundation also purchases computers and software for schools of special education students, to ensure that children who are visually impaired or blind are exposed to the latest computer technology at an early age to maximize their chances for a better future.
- **The Little Rock Foundation Website:** [www.tlrf.org](http://www.tlrf.org) provides information on Federal, State and Local support services available. Current events throughout the tri-state area are posted monthly. A list of appropriate toys, mannerisms for the blind, therapy activities, new medical procedures, orientation/mobility, software recommendations, internet links, local workshops and parent to parent networking can be found in the "helpful hints" section. With this website we are able to communicate to families, who may not have the ability to attend workshops or have the resources to obtain information about Early Intervention programs for children from the ages of 0 to 3.
- **Educating Legislators:** we continue to lobby for expanded legislation from federal, state and local authorities to support children who are blind or visually impaired.
- **Blindness Awareness Month:** Through the efforts of the Little Rock Foundation, in 2009 Governor Jon Corzine declared October as Blindness Awareness Month. This resolution will educate the public about eye disease and eye care and ways to address the rising trend of blindness and severe visual impairments. Since 2009, we have added the following states to assist us: Pennsylvania, Delaware, Michigan, Louisiana and recently Oregon.
- **Car Donation Program:** Help us serve children who are blind or visually impaired by donating your vehicle to our car donation program. All proceeds qualify as tax-deductible contributions.
